

7. The Building to the East of Ash House, 14 Bell Villas



This building dates from the same period as Ash House but is thought to have been built a few years later. It is constructed in stone with a slate roof and represents a widely used alternative vernacular construction of the period (Rough stone or brick with whitewashed rendering was a further, cheaper alternative). This building was originally a dwelling-house but, in common with many along Bell Villas, it now houses a commercial activity in the form of a solicitor's office.
