

### **13. Clickemin Farm Buildings**



Clickemin Farm had a number of adjacent farm buildings which were located adjacent to the farmhouse but originally separated by a small orchard. When farming ceased and the farmhouse became a dwelling, the former farm buildings were converted into six dwellings, with a single shared access on the western side of the complex. All other access on the A696 has been blocked off by the construction of matching brick walls to the left of the lamp standard as seen in the photograph. The accommodation in the Clickemin Farm buildings provides a well-designed, quiet and secluded area which avoids much of the noise and interference from the main road.

The Clickemin Farmhouse (seen to the right of the dwellings), along with the former farm buildings, form a typical farming unit which, in its overall external appearance, gives a good indication of how it would once have appeared when working. In terms of historical and architectural significance, the Farmhouse and the Farm Buildings should be considered together.
